One fundamental aid is a good map. We also strongly advise the use of a GPS.

REMEMBER:

At traffic circles (roundabouts), vehicles already within the circle **HAVE PRIORITY**. Upon approaching traffic circles, you will see little signs, saying: "*Vous n'avez pas la priorité*", which reminds you of this fact. French drivers strictly observe this rule of the road, and will expect you to observe it as well.

Note: if you enter a town or village and cannot find to the next point on your route, follow signs for **TOUTES DIRECTIONS** until you come upon sign the sign you are looking for.

Kilometer to Mile Conversion

1 Km (kilometers) = .62 mile

Avignon TGV Station to Le Chateau de Gault:

-The car rental offices are at the rear of the train station.

This route should take approximately 45 mins

1. Head east on **Route du Confluent** 36 m
2. Turn left to stay on **Route du Confluent** 78 m
3. Turn left toward **Bd Pierre Boulle** 67 m
4. Turn right onto **Bd Pierre Boulle** 350 m
5. At the roundabout, take the **1st** exit onto the **Rocade Charles de Gaulle** ramp to **La Rocade Sud/Aéroport Avignon Sud** 290 m
6. Merge onto **Rocade Charles de Gaulle**
Go through 1 roundabout 1.5 km
7. Turn right onto **N570** 32 m
8. Slight right onto **Rocade Charles de Gaulle** 1.9 km
9. Turn right onto **Av. Pierre Semard/D907** 1.4 km
10. At the roundabout, take the **2nd** exit onto **N7**
Go through 4 roundabouts 7.0 km
11. Slight right toward **D900** 200 m



12. Continue straight onto D900

Marseille-Marignane Airport to Le Chateau de Goult:

This route has tolls and should take approximately 1 hour and 1 min.

1. Head **southeast** 300 m
2. Turn right toward **D20D** 160 m
3. At the roundabout, take the **2nd** exit onto **D20D** 400 m
4. Keep right at the fork, follow signs for **A7/Marseille/Aix-en-Provence/Fos-sur-Mer** and merge onto **D20** 2.5 km
5. Take the ramp onto **D9** 2.3 km
6. Slight right to merge onto **D113** toward **A7/Salon-de-Provence/Vitrolles-Centre/Lyon** 1.5 km
7. Merge onto **A7** via the ramp on the left to **Salon-de-Provence/Rognac/Berre**
Partial toll road 49.2 km
8. Take exit **25-Cavaillon** toward **Beaucaire/Tarascon/Saint-Rémy-de-Provence/L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue/Apt**
Toll road 1.1 km
9. Continue straight
Toll road 500 m
10. Keep right at the fork, follow signs for **D99/Cavaillon/L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue/Apt** and merge onto **D99** 1.2 km

Aix-en-Provence TGV to Le Chateau de Goult:

The car rental offices are on the far side of the station (across the train tracks) if you arrive from the north

This route has tolls and should take approximately 1 hour.

1. Head **north** toward **D9F** 230 m
2. Turn left onto **D9F** 82 m
3. Merge onto **D9** via the ramp to **A7/Aéroport Marignane/Vitrolles** 5.0 km
4. Merge onto **D113** via the ramp to **A7/Salon-de-Provence/Vitrolles-Centre** 1.8 km
5. Merge onto **A7** via the ramp on the left to **Salon-de-Provence/Rognac/Berre**
Partial toll road 49.2 km
6. Take exit **25-Cavaillon** toward **Beaucaire/Tarascon/Saint-Rémy-de-Provence/L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue/Apt**
Toll road 1.1 km
7. Continue straight
Toll road 500 m
8. Keep right at the fork, follow signs for **D99/Cavaillon/L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue/Apt** and merge onto **D99** 1.2 km
9. Continue onto **Route de Marseille/D938**
 Continue to follow D938 300 m
10. At the roundabout, take the **3rd** exit onto **Av. du Pont** 550 m

Before Coming to France - Keep in Mind

Money: Bring a bank card for cash withdrawals from ATM machines in France. Your bank account will be charged the equivalent in your normal currency. ATMs can be found in several surrounding villages near the house. We suggest you get some cash at the airport when you arrive for tolls/ incidentals. This is cheaper than going to a bank or foreign exchange window.

American Express traveler's checks are no longer accepted in most parts of France --- don't bother to bring them. American Express Cards are generally also not accepted. MasterCard and Visa are accepted, but either one may charge a 2 to 3% surcharge on every purchase made in a foreign currency. We strongly suggest to call your card provider in advance to tell them you will be in France.

Gadgets: If you bring a hair---dryer, make sure it is able to accept up to 240 volts For any dual voltage (110 -240 volts) electric items you will need a **France Plug Adaptor**, not a voltage converter. Tri---band cell phones, digital cameras, Ipods, razors and laptop computers are almost universally dual voltage, but check to be sure.

Telephones: For mobile phone coverage, you will need either a tri-band phone or rent a SIM card or mobile-phone for France. www.cellhire.com/ can deliver either to your home before you leave.

If you bring your own mobile phone, beware of excessively high international data roaming rates (especially with AT&T). You should be able to shut your email and internet capability off while in France Data Roaming ('off') without disturbing the text and telephone functions.

If you do not take a mobile phone with you, think about bringing an international calling card with local access numbers or purchasing a French prepaid international phone card (ticket de téléphone) available at train stations, airports, tabacs and newsstands. This is for all calls considered to be long distance, which includes calls to French mobile phone numbers (starting with 06).

To make international calls from France dial 00 then the country code and number. The country code for the USA and Canada is 1.
